VIII. Allegany County Transportation Workplan

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This work plan is an initial step-by-step guide that describes the technical activities that must be conducted to achieve the overall goal of developing a local Coordinated Transportation Plan; entitled the Allegany County Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan.

As activities are refined by the Allegany County Transportation Task Force, addendums to this work plan will be updated to better define using SMART Outcome Objectives. SMART objectives are defined as:

- Specific
- Measurable
- Achievable
- Relevant
- Time-specific

A well-defined work plan will allow the Allegany County Transportation Task Force to examine the detailed list of all tasks and sub-tasks necessary to complete the specific scope of work. As the work plan is completed, updates to the Allegany County Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan will be distributed to the Allegany County Transportation Task Force membership for review and approval.
